The Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), the official humanitarian service arm of Lions Clubs International, contributes hundreds of millions of dollars to eyesight protection as well as various health protection and disaster relief projects year after year. Where does the money come from? It mainly comes from donations of Lions Clubs worldwide. On top of that, annually, membership dues paid by each individual Lion are contributed to Lions Clubs International (LCI) at the International, Multiple District and District levels to help run the organization.

Put simply, Lions Clubs membership dues are annual donations made by each and every member of Lions Clubs to LCI. This means that every Lion pays and plays a part contributing to the worldwide hu-

The presentations in Cantonese (on 28/9/2013) and in Putonghua (on 5/10/2013) both had attendance in scores. Apparently, health is a common interest to many.

For the 70+ Lions Clubs in the Greater Sydney District and Nor-

folk Island (District N5) their AGM will be held at the Bathurst Convention on 15-17 November 2013. Finally, we will be having our Christmas Party on Wednesday, 11 December at the Zilver Restaurant. Tickets are still at \$50 per head. #### Health Talks Expo 2013 report

On September 12, 2013 we had our press release for the 2013 Sydney Chinese Lions Health Talks Expo Week. It was hosted by Lion Dr May Wong, who is this year's chairperson. The event was attended by medical specialists, including Dr Tony Kuo, Dr Elis Choy and Dr Kenneth Ho; Lions Club members and Committee members, including President Lion Jason Zhang, and Past presidents Lion Mei Cheng and Lion Anthony Cheung; our sponsors, as well as our media partners.



The press release re-iterated the relevance of the Health Talks given the rise in chronic diseases due to our lifestyles habits including

consuming processed foods high in sugar and salt, indulging in alcohol and compounded by a sedentary lifestyle. This has resulted in disease processes such as diabetes as well as obstructive sleep apnea. The theme for this years talks is "Ask the Specialist: Conditions moving from the East to West" Sydney Chinese Lions Club is privileged to have the presence of several Sydney medical specialists who will speak in Cantonese and Mandarin about conditions, which are prevalent in the Western World and bear importance to a Chinese population. They will talk within their expertise on the pathophysiology, signs and symptoms and management options. Through these talks, the public will learn about prevention and methods to improve our health. These specialists are involved with teaching for universities within their hospitals. This year, the health talks expo will be spoken in Cantonese on the 28th September and Mandarin on the 5th of October. The event will start at 9:30am and finish at 4pm. Our speakers include Dr Ken Loi, an obesity and Bariatric surgeon who will discuss surgical options for obesity in diabetic patients, Dr Ellis Choy, a Plastic and Breast Reconstructive Surgeon who will discuss breast reconstructive options as a treatment modality. On that day, we also have Dr Eric Wong, a respiratory physician who will deliver a talk on his interest; disordered sleep breathing. Finally, Dr Aaron Yeung, an interventional cardiologist will provide an introduction to coronary artery disease. In the consecutive Saturday, we will have again 4 specialists; Dr Muh Geot Wong a nephrologist providing a talk on diabetic kidney disease, complimented by Dr Kenneth Ho, providing an overview of "Diabetes and You". Dr Tony Kuo, an Ear Nose and Throat Surgeon who will be talking about Common ENT diseases and health. Finally, Dr Audrey Wang is a urologist who will explore benign prostate hypertrophy.

In addition, it was announced that a special focus of this year's Health Expo Week was chronic Hepatitis B. This is a condition which is prevalent in many Chinese migrants as they are asymptomatic carriers. It can have the potential to cause damage, resulting in liver cancer and even death. With this in mind, they have arranged a talk by a gastroenterologist who wil talk about the prevention, transmission and treatment of Hepatitis B. Following that, they will offer free blood tests to screen for Hepatitis B in the blood of consented participants. These results will be sent out to the participant and their family doctors for further follow up. As a study that is approved by the UNSW Ethics Committee, all results will be strictly confidential.

Lion Dr May Wong elaborated on the details of the day. During the extended lunch break, there will be one-on-one health consultations with doctors who will measure baseline characteristics such as height, weight, blood pressure and pulse rate. We will be giving out free glucometers to eligible participants, supplied by Abbott Diabetes Care. Furthermore, they will be available to answer questions regarding health. There will also be activities from our other sponsors; Blackmores will be providing samples from their extensive product range including Kaloba, a non-pharmaceutical way in treating acute bronchitis, BreastScreen will have a live booking system for women aged 50-74 to have interpreter based breast screening sessions.

Finally, Lion Dr May Wong expressed her gratitude towards the event's Sponsors, which range from local (Hurstville City Council, St George Private Hospital), national (Cancer Council, Breast Screen, Cancer Institute, Blackmores, Conrad Properties, Highlakes Property and China Venture, and global (Abbott Diabetes Care). Furthermore, she acknowledged the influence of our supporters (Hurstville Club Central, Omron, Douglass Hanly Moir) as well as our Media supporters (TVBA, Sing Tao newspaper and The Leader).

She concluded the press conference with a personal statement about how the event has endowed her with invaluable experiences for her clinical pathway as she hopes to be a doctor that is intertwined with her community.



## **Health Talks Expo 2013**

### 繼連續三年成功舉辦公眾健康公益講座後,各界反應熱烈, 澳洲

雪梨華人獅子會基於「我們服務」的信念, 茲決定分別在9月 28日星期六(粵語)和10月5日星期六(普通話)在Hurstville好事圍 之 Club Central舉辦一個公開的健康公益講座周。籌委會成員 包括黃茹蔚醫生(籌委會主席)、張重元會長、前會長張俊明 博士及鄭美霞太平紳士。



此次健康公益講座提出大家日常生活方式和習慣,高糖和高鹽

的加工食品的攝取,酒精的依賴,以及久坐不動的生活方式與慢性疾病的息息相關。這些不良的生活習慣 便是導致如糖尿病以及阻塞性睡眠呼吸暫停等的主要原因。今年講座的主題是"問問我們的專家:從東方到 西方的變化"。雪梨華人獅子會榮幸的邀請到幾位說廣東話和普通話的醫療專家們,來和大家探討在西方社 會普遍的一些狀況對東方人尤其是中國人群的重要性。專家們將和大家討論專業範圍內的病理,體徵和症 狀及對應的辦法。通過這次會談,市民可以了解到一些預防的方法,來改善我們的健康。這些專家也都是 同時在不同的醫院執業和大學任教的。

今年的"健康講座"周將分為9月28日廣東話專場和10月5日普通話專場。均為週六上午9點30分開始,下午4點 結束。講演嘉賓包括肥胖癥外科醫生Dr Ken Loi,他將同大家討論手術來解決糖尿病患者中肥胖癥的可行 性;整形和乳房重建外科醫生Dr Ellis Choi,他將為大家闡述乳房重建作為治療方式的選擇。當天我們也邀 請到了呼吸系統專家Dr Eric Wong,他會與大家探討睡眠呼吸紊亂的問題;介入心臟病學家Dr Aaron Yeung 將為大家介紹一下冠狀動脈疾病。

在接下來的週六,我們還將榮幸的邀請到另外4名專家:腎臟病學家Dr Muh Geot 他會為大家講解糖尿病腎 病有關知識; Dr Kenneth Ho為大家提供題為"糖尿病與你"的概述;耳鼻喉科外科醫生Dr Tony Kuo,將談論 常見的耳鼻喉疾病與大家的健康關係。最後,泌尿科醫生Dr Audrey Wang將與大家探討良性前列腺肥大的 有關問題。

這次健康公益講座有一個跟以往不同的焦點,那就是針對慢性乙型肝炎,因為這是一個盛行於許多中國移 民的病癥,因為許多人是乙肝病毒的無症狀攜帶者。如果不加注意,也是可能導致肝癌甚至死亡的。考慮 到這一點,我們也榮幸的邀請到胃腸病專家為大家講解乙型肝炎的預防,傳播和治療,在這之後他們將為 一些自願參與的朋友提供免費的乙型肝炎抽血化驗。化驗結果會送至各個參與者的家中和其家庭醫生處以 便有需要的人士日後的治療。此次化驗經由新南威爾士大學倫理委員會的批准,所有的結果均會為參與者 嚴格保密。

在講座中場休息其間,會有一對一的諮詢項目。專家們將會為大家測量一些基本特徵,如身高,體重,血 壓和脈搏。我們也將給予一些參與者雅培糖尿病護理提供的免費血糖儀。專家們將回答大家有關健康的問 題。Blackmores作為此次的贊助商之一,也會為大家發放一些樣品,例如包括非藥品治療急性支氣管炎的 Kaloba; BreastScreen將會為50-74歲的女性現場預訂乳房篩檢,並提供口譯員。
