



Editorial

At the next Members Dinner Meeting in the coming month, Sydney Chinese Lions will be having their annual Change Over Dinner. It is a function to mark the handing over from all "current year" to "coming year" office-bearers. The dinner will be held on 5 June 2013 at the Zilver Restaurant with a 7:00 pm for 7:30 pm start. Tickets are \$50 per head and booking is essential, through Secretary Lion Janice Cheung, at the latest by 28 May.

Taking this opportunity we would like to express the gratitude of all members of Sydney Chinese Lions towards President Mei Cheng for her enthusiastic and unrelenting efforts working for the Club for not one, nor two nor three, but four long years. Sydney Chinese Lions led by President Mei collected over the past 4 years in excess of \$200,000 donations to various charities. Beneficiaries include St John Ambulance (NSW), Lions Clubs International Foundation, Australian Red Cross (NSW), CareFlight and others.

Under the helm of President Mei the number of Sydney Chinese Lions members almost doubled from 70 in 2009 to 130+ today. During this period she presided over a range of existing and new service projects

for the Club: The Humanitarian Scholarships, the Teal Ribbon Scholars Scheme, the Traditional Chinese Medicine Research Scholarships in conjunction with the University of Technology and Science, the Annual Health Public Forum as well as the Finance and Investment Management Forum.

Clearly, replacing President Mei is not an easy task. Fortunately we have Lion Jason Zhang coming forward to carry the baton. President Mei will stay on as Immediate Past President to offer Lion Jason support.

We would like to express our gratitude to Lion Janice Cheung who will have completed her term of Club Secretary three times over. The secretarial team under her care made significant contributions towards the management of the Club's business over the past three years. Indeed, Secretary Janice and her team performed the secretarial tasks with dexterity and professionalism.

Also, Sydney Chinese Lions are grateful to the entire 2012~2013 Board of Directors and office-bearers for their dedicated service throughout the last Lions year.

The 2013 Charity Ball was another success. Despite the high Australian Dollar and the receding mining boom it was well patronized by over 350 Lions and guests. The function is expected to make a small profit. Treasurer Lion Tim is currently collating the figures. The 2013 Charity Ball Financial Report is expected to be out shortly. By then at a joint sitting of the new and old Boards, the amount to be donated to St John Ambulance (NSW) this year will be decided. As usual, a press conference will be held for the Cheque Presentation Ceremony on a date to be announced.

This year, the Incoming Officers' Training Forum for District N5 Clubs will be held at the Bankstown Sports Club on Sunday, 26 May. All club officers are invited to attend. All those who are interested please contact Second Vice District Governor Lion Dr Anthony Cheung for details.

Message from International President Madden

Dear Lions,

Throughout the year I've drawn analogies to sports in my speeches and messages. Consider this - many baseball games are won with 2 outs in the 9th inning, there have been a number of World Cup soccer matches decided in extra time, and yes - many auto races are decided during the last lap of the race.

We are quickly approaching the end of the year, our "last lap" of the race. By now you have held all of your pit stops, you have hopefully done your community needs assessments, participated in the Reading Action Program and Global Service Action Campaigns, attended or soon will attend your district and multiple district conventions, and completed your qualifications for the Club Excellence Award or District Governor Team Excellence Award. In short, you have completed the necessary steps that should ensure a successful year.

But if history is an indication, we know that much can happen in the last two months of the year. June is particularly significant with regard to adding new members and new clubs as well as keeping members. Here is the reason:

23% of new clubs are chartered in May/June

18% of total adds occur in May/June

BUT - 30% of drops occur in May/June

The above statistics are an average over the past three years of comparative data. But clearly, the percentages cited paint a clear picture that the months of May and June are crucial to whether or not we have a strong finish to our year-long race.

With that in mind, and considering the above quote from Yogi Berra, we still have work to do.

Club presidents - have you surveyed your members? Have you engaged your new members? Member satisfaction is all-important to the overall health of a club. It determines whether a member stays, or a member leaves. The new *Membership Satisfaction Guide* is a valuable resource all clubs should consult on a regular basis.

Take another look at the requirements for the Club Excellence Award - specifically the membership requirement. It says, "The club achieved a net growth in membership (including branch club members when applicable) or sponsored a new club..." Remember - you must achieve all requirements. Have you fulfilled the service requirement? There is still time to engage in a community project, like the Reading Action Program.

District governors - now is the time to survey the clubs in your district. You should also review the requirements for the District Governor Team Excellence Award.

Your actions, and your success during the months of May and June will determine whether we struggle to the finish line, or take a victory lap in Hamburg!

Dear Lions,

When I have the opportunity to visit projects that are completed with the help of Lions Clubs International Foundation, I am always impressed with the range of humanitarian needs that are met. Lions believe in helping their communities and the world in so many different ways.

I was able to visit several projects in India this month, including the Lions Calcutta Greater Vidya Mandir School. The school provides an education to children who may not have such opportunities otherwise. Last year, LCIF awarded Lions a grant to help expand this school, allowing it to raise the enrollment capacity from 980 students to 1,400.

Through this project, Lions are not only serving and supporting the young people in their communities, they are also meeting a humanitarian need by providing educational opportunities. I know how important these opportunities can be for a child's development. As my father told me when I was young, you cannot keep your wealth and health forever, but only knowledge for the rest of your life.

Lions in India not only showed me this school, but also brought me to the B. B. D. Bagh blood bank at the Marwari Relief Society hospital in Kolkata. There, Lions ensure that blood donations are properly managed. Also, the capacity of the blood bank was increased through new equipment from an LCIF grant.

This notable and needed project caused me to reflect on the greater accomplishments of LCIF: Lions come together to accomplish something great and make a difference for many people worldwide. As the needs for humanitarian service evolve with time, so too must Lions and LCIF. And, I believe that we are. Thank you for your support and efforts to help people in need!
