In the lead up to the ceremony, hymns from the Lest we Forget - the Music of Remembrance CD were played to augment the atmosphere.

At 9:00 am, the Remembrance Ceremony began. Lion Ron Gattone presented a formal introduction and led the Lord's Prayer. Then VDG Lion Dennis Halpin read out the names of Lions and Lions partners who had departed since the Bathurst Convention. When a name was read, the picture of the deceased in question was shown on the giant screens. Family

The latter group accepted the flags and turned around and faced the audience whom were all standing by then, showing respect. The flag receivers then dipped their flags to salute the conventioners before solemnly

The spot-light moved slowly back to the centre of the stage where I was standing. I had the District gong and gavel in my hands. I struck the gong once and declared the convention over. Upon bidding the conventioners "Farewell and God Bless!", the spot-light went off. The whole auditorium remained in total darkness and complete silence for a while before the room lights came back on again. The darkness and silence following the sound of the gong signified the conclusion of a very memorable Convention 2014.
