


A Message from Our International President







An Open Letter to Australian Lions in Support of Dr WK Tam for International President

My Fellow Australian Lions

As you may be aware, at the Lions Clubs International Seattle Convention to be held on 4-8 July 2011, we will have the opportunity of **electing International 1st Vice President Dr. W.K. TAM as International President for the 2011 -2012 Lions Year.** Dr. Tam will be the sole candidate presented to the Convention for the position. When he is elected, he will become the first Chinese person to hold such an esteemed office in the 94 years' history of Lions.

Dr. Tam is highly qualified for the position. At the international level, prior to becoming the current **International 1st Vice President**, in 2008-9, he served as **International 2nd Vice President** and in 2003-5, he served as **International Director**. He was appointed by 7 International Presidents to serve on the International Board as **Board Appointee 7 times**. Dr. Tam also served as Member on Executive Committee of the International Board in 2004-5. Further details of Dr. Tam can be found in the attached leaflet.

As an Australian Lion with Chinese background, I for one, support Dr. Tam's candidacy and strive to help out in his election campaign. I am hoping to put together a team of Australian Lions to attend the Seattle Convention, with a view to supporting Dr. Tam and being part of this very rare and unique historical process. When we are there, we will also have the opportunity of voting PID Barry Palmer to the position of International 2nd Vice President.

For this purpose, I am writing to you to urge you to register for and attend the Seattle Convention, joining me and my team of Tam supporters from Australasia.

When we are there, apart from the regular Conventional activities, we could also take part in some or all of the following events:

taking an active involvement in support of Tam during the Parade on 5 July

attending the opening session on 6 July

taking part in the demonstration on 7 July morning and reception party in the evening

voting for Dr. Tam and PID Barry Palmer on 8 July in the morning and attending the Victory party in the evening.

The Convention Registration Fee is USD100 if you register by the end of December 2010. Then it'll go up to USD150 after that and USD200 after 31 March 2011. So registering early actually saves you a few dollars. I also attach a copy of the Convention Registration Form for your reference.

In District 201N5, which covers the Sydney area and Norfolk Island, there are some 75 Clubs with around 1,750 members. Amongst these, there are around 6 Chinese-based Clubs. Sydney Chinese Lions is the first of these Chinese-based Clubs chartered in April 1995.

Over the past fifteen years, under the leadership of President Mei Cheng, Hon. President Dr Anthony Cheung and other Past Presidents, in conjunction with the relentless effort of its members, and on top of all these, the generous donations and sponsorships received from the community, the Club has donated over \$400,000 to a number of charities including the Royal Flying Doctor Service of Australia, St John (NSW), the Australian Red Cross, the Sir David Martin Foundation, the Fred Hollows Foundation, Westmead and Concord Hospitals, the Children's Mobility (Hart Walker) Foundation and the Elderly Australian Chinese Homes. Thousands have reaped the benefits.
