Dear Lions,

When I took office at the international convention in Seattle last July I did not think that I could ever be more proud to be a Lion. I was mistaken. Over the past year all that you have accomplished to make our world a better place has inspired me and made me prouder than ever.

I would say that it borders on the miraculous!

I have always believed that Lions can change the world but this year we did so literally. By planting more than 9.7 million trees we have changed the very face of and altered - for the better - the basic processes that sustain and renew all life on Earth.

A single tree can absorb as much as 48 pounds of carbon dioxide each year and produce enough oxygen to support two human beings. At maturity, the trees planted by Lions will be removing more than 20,000 tons of carbon dioxide and adding enough oxygen to the atmosphere to support almost 17 million people!

Lions Clubs International Foundation

Dear Lions,

I am amazed and proud of all that Lions Clubs International Foundation has accomplished this past year with your help. The clubs and projects that Judy and I had an opportunity to visit while I was Chairperson showed us just how much our Foundation gives hope and needed services to people around the world.

Through our commitment to help <u>eliminate measles</u>, Lions and LCIF are responding to the challenge set forth by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to raise US\$10 million. By now, you should know the impact a single vaccine can have for a child - it can save the child's life and prevent serious complications that come with measles for just US\$1.

I thank our <u>generous donors</u> who have contributed to the One Shot, One Life: Lions Measles Initiative. As the year ends, there is still work to be done to meet the Gates Foundation's challenge grant. In the upcoming Lion's year, I urge everyone to make a donation or hold a fundraiser for measles. We can help save 157 million children alongside our partners. What an accomplishment that will be!

Our other programs also have a significant impact around the world. As LCIF's flagship youth program, <u>Lions Quest</u> not only added new countries this year, teaching even more students positive life skills; it also gained new partnerships, like the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, and tested new programs, like Out-of-School Time.

Our <u>SightFirst</u> program expanded its reach through SightFirst China Action III, now addressing issues like eliminating blinding trachoma and improving low vision services. LCIF also continues important sight saving work with partners like Bausch + Lomb, Johnson & Johnson and the World Health Organization. With these partners, we work to combat childhood blindness.

The Foundation's <u>disaster relief</u> efforts show that Lions not only respond to immediate emergencies, but are also there as long as it takes to help give disaster victims their lives back: a new nursing school was completed in Haiti two years after an earthquake; a new school was built in Louisiana, USA, seven years after a hurricane; and needed relief continues to be provided in places like Japan one year after an earthquake and tsunami, and in Thailand after severe flooding.

It has been an honor to serve as your Foundation's Chairperson, and as a Lion. I thank you all for your support.

- The maximum character count for the Chinese essay is 2000 characters. For the English essay, the maximum is 2500 words.
- For both for the Chinese and English essays, one First Prize will be awarded, along with two Second Prizes, and two Third Prizes.

ESSAY ASSESSEMENT PANELS

- A separate panel of experts will judge the Chinese essays and the English essays. Each panel will consist of five members drawn from universities, chaired by a leading member of the China Studies Centre.
- The decision of assessment panels will be final.

AWARDS

For both the Chinese and English essays, First Prize is a cash award of A\$3000; Second Prize is A\$2000; Third Prize is A\$1000. All winners who attend the competition award ceremony will receive a travel allowance of A\$1000, as well as a visit to the University of Sydney, and their essay will be included in the brochure of the 40th anniversary of Australia-China diplomatic relations essay competition.

The China Studies Centre will inform the competition winners individually around mid-September. Winners will also be invited to participate in the competition's award ceremony and cocktail reception in Sydney on 13 November 2012, where they can share their essays and thoughts with guests and media on this very happy occasion.

Confirmed guests of honour for the award ceremony include the Governor of New South Wales, Her Excellency Professor Marie Bashir AC CVO, also Chancellor of the University of Sydney; and the University's Vice-Chancellor, Dr Michael Spence.

Today, there are Lions clubs in 206 countries and geographical areas all over the world. In District 201N5, which covers the Sydney area and Norfolk Island, there are some 76 clubs with around 1,750 members. Amongst these, there are around 7 Chinese-based clubs. Sydney Chinese Lions is the first of these Chinese-based clubs chartered in April 1995.

Over the past sixteen years, under the leadership of President Mei Cheng, Past. President Dr Anthony Cheung and other Past Presidents, in conjunction with the relentless effort of its members, and on top of all these, the generous donations and sponsorships received from the community, the club has donated over \$500,000 to a number of charities including Lions Clubs International Foundation, the Royal Flying Doctor Service of Australia, St John (NSW), the Australian Red Cross, Care-Flight, the Sir David Martin Foundation, the Fred Hollows Foundation, Westmead and Concord Hospitals, the Children's Mobility (Hart Walker) Foundation and the Elderly Australian Chinese Homes. Thousands have reaped the benefits.
