After the convention, even though there were very many favourable feedbacks, I received three complaints. They were all directed to our requesting speakers/presenters to prematurely discontinue. I regret all the inconvenience caused to the speakers/presenters in question.

However, I wish to stress two critical points: (1) At N5 Convention 2014, ALL speakers/ presenters were given their FULL length of allocated time as published in the Convention Booklet, ONLY those who exceeded their time allowance were asked to discontinue. (2) As a result of responsible time keeping, all the segments of the convention were implemented as planned. On top of this, ALL District Chairpersons and Multiple District Chairpersons who wished to present their portfolios had the op-

portunity to do so for a prescribed duration of five minutes each. There were no less than twelve of them. Clearly, if speakers/presenters were allowed to carry on for as long as they liked, it would have been at the expense of those who were at the back of the queue and these would have missed out altogether. I honestly believe that *Having a Fair Go for ALL* is the best yardstick to employ while tackling this very sensitive issue at conventions. I thank Lion Anthony Jackson of Epping Eastwood Lions for helping us with the time keeping task and for his courage and integrity in striking the gong whenever time was up.
