Message from District Governor Greg Dunn

G'day folks,

I've been District Governor for 1 month already and possibly the fastest month of my life. If the other months go as fast as this last one, Lions Lady Judith and I are going to miss out on what so far is shaping up to be a marvellous adventure. I have found that being District Governor is exciting, it's stimulating, and in another perspective, it's terrifying. All of a sudden you find you are responsible for virtually all of the Lions and the Clubs in Greater Sydney; the biggest and greatest City in Australia. Sure, it's all covered over with hype and razzmatazz in the initial stages but given time to contemplate, this is the reality. It's this reality that brings you down to earth and you humbly start thinking, "My friends put me here because they had confidence in me, what can I give them in return?"

I've no doubt that you have had much better District Governors in the past, I'm quite often reminded of this and I acknowledge their expertise. But all I can do is my best, and you have my promise on this. My standard statement when I am called to MC a function is: "Part of my job as MC is to ensure that you enjoy yourself, but I can't do it alone; you have to help". It's these people who have "Been There" that can show us where it is. It is those "Done That's" that can show us how to do it. When you stop learning, you stop living.

Why is it that some of us look upon District as something to be avoided? District is there to help, not to hinder. Our District has some of the brightest, friendliest, intelligent, sympathetic, helpful and motivated Lions in the world. I am not in their league but they inspire me to go to greater heights. I know there are more of these wonderful Lions out there, and I need their help. The District needs their help. The pay's not much but the rewards are unbelievable.

I have said it's exciting but when I look at the statistics, I find the tables turn somewhat. I tend to feel depressed when I see a minus sign before the net growth figure. The pail is being emptied faster than we can refill it. I feel depressed for the community that they are losing probably one of the greatest resources they could possibly get; I feel depressed for the children with Cerebral Palsy who cannot afford a Hart Walker; For the Children from overseas who land on our doorstep with nowhere to go; for all of those who rely on Lions to help and will have no one else to turn. It is not the people being lost, it is the combined strength of a team of dedicated individuals who can make the task achievable. "Teamwork is the tool which enables an ordinary person to achieve extraordinary accomplishments".

While we are on the subject of District, who's coming to Bankstown Sports Club on the 9th of September?

Perish the thought that we would need to hire the auditorium because everybody turned up; --- an expense willingly and gladly accepted. How many Clubs are scheduled to visit another Club? Wow! How long has this been going on; a great experience. As I said previously, How can we work as a team if we don't know who is on our side? Remember that word "MINTEN"? A Minimum of Ten percent increase in membership of each Club. September 9th can go a long way towards helping you to not only reach this goal but exceed it.

REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE RECEIVED FOR HANDS ON INDIA - SABEEHA MAILANJI OF CASTLE HILL

Chiropractic students (along with Sabeeha Mailanji of Castle Hill) from Macquarie University are participating in the Hands on India program 2012. In September 2012 a team of 24 final year Chiropractic students and 9 Chiropractors will be based in Siliguri, India. They will spend 2 weeks, providing chiropractic and basic medical care to the rock breaking communities, tea pickers (who earn \$1 a day), slum dwellers and working with the Mother Teresa nuns and the children in their care. The fund raising last year also allowed them to purchase a school in the slum which is also used as a community centre and sewing centre for women in the evenings, visit <http://handsonindia2012.wordpress.com/>. Money will go towards equipment, medical supplies, interpreters and transportation to remote areas and community projects in Siliguri. This year they are fundraising to get electricity and furniture into existing schools. Students and supervisors all pay all their own travel and living costs. However, to make this trip possible they aim to raise \$45,000. Lions Emblem installed at St John Headquarters



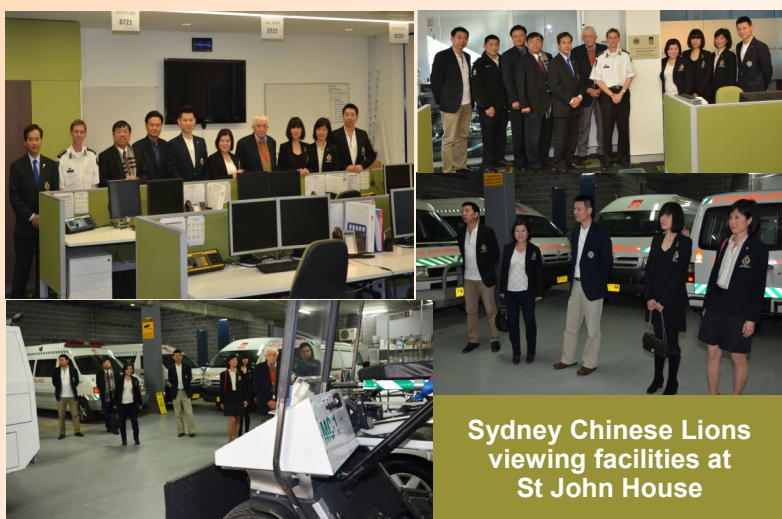
In recognition of a \$60,000 donation by Sydney Chinese Lions, St John (NSW) recently installed a plaque at their Communications Room inside St John House, their new Headquarters in Burwood.

The Communications Room, dubbed the nerve centre of their life-saving capabilities, is one of the key facilities at the St John Headquarters.

On 14 July 2012, members of the Board of Directors of Sydney Chinese Lions were invited to visit the facility. The Lions were warmly received by Maj Gen (rtd) Warren Glenny, Deputy Chair of the St John Board, Mr Brett Murray, Mr Huw Price and others. The visitors were shown the Communications Room where the plaque is displayed as well as some of the vehicles that St John employs for field operations.

To date, Sydney Chinese Lions have donated over \$100,000 to St John (NSW). Their first donation was made in 2007 when they donated an amount of \$41,000. On that occasion, in recognition of the Lions' contributions, a brand new ambulance bearing the Lions emblem was named after the Club.

The Lions Club of Sydney Chinese Inc. is a member of Lions Clubs International, an international non profit community service organization, upholding a common motto "WE SERVE". Today, there are Lions clubs in 207 countries and geographical areas all over the world. In District 201N5, which covers the Sydney area and Norfolk Island, there are some 71 clubs with around 1,650 members. Amongst these, there are around 7 Chinese-based clubs. Sydney Chinese Lions is the first of these Chinese-based clubs chartered in April 1995.
