The Lions Club of Sydney Chinese Inc. is a member of Lions Clubs International, an international non profit community service organization, upholding a common motto "WE SERVE". Today, there are Lions Clubs in 202 countries and geographical areas all over the world. In District 201N5, which covers the Sydney area and Norfolk Island, there are some 75 Clubs with around 1,700 members. Amongst these, there are around 7 Chinese-based Clubs. Sydney Chinese, chartered in April 1995, is the first Chinese-based Lions club set up in New South Wales, Australia.

On the Lions' Emblem, there is a lion on each of the two sides, facing opposite directions - one looks back to the past with pride, and the other looks to the future with vision and hope. This Emblem aptly describes the community work that is being done at the Club. Ever since their charter, the Club has been well supported by the community including corporate entities and small businesses, as well as private individuals. Over the past fourteen years, under the leadership of President Dr. Anthony Cheung and other Past Presidents in conjunction with the relentless effort of its members, and on top of all these, the generous donations and sponsorships received from the community, the Club has raised and donated over three hundred thousand dollars to a number of charities including the Royal Flying Doctor Service, St John Ambulance, the Australian Red Cross, the Sir David Martin Foundation, the Fred Hollows Foundation, the Westmead and Concord Hospitals, the Children's Mobility (Hart Walker) Foundation and the Elderly Australian Chinese Homes. Thousands had reaped the benefits. The Club is also mindful of encouraging young adults to participate in humanitarian services, hence, it has been offering its humanitarian scholarships since 2003.

All these achievements have come about not only because of good leadership but also as a result of dedication and hard work of all the members. On top of this, the support by political leaders, the Consulate General of the People's Republic of China, the Chinese media, fellow lions, sponsors and the community at large has been vital and is greatly appreciated.

To celebrate the Club's 14<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2009, they will feature a signature event - their Charity Ball 2009 to be held on Saturday, 7 March 2009 at the Parkside Ballroom, Sydney Convention and Exhibition Centre, Darling Harbour. The major recipient of the net proceeds of this event is St John Ambulance Australia (NSW). The donation is made to support St John and its services to the community. – Transporting elderly people to church on 9/28.

Lions use taxis and their own cars to transport elderly people to Jarvenpaa church. Our own club mainly takes care of the inhabitants of the Pihlavisto home for the elderly, using Inva taxis. In practice this means transporting 5 - 6 persons.

– X-mas Kettle fund gathering event December 17 - 23.

For several years now Jarvenpaa Lions have assisted the Salvation Army with the Christmas Kettle fund raising. Lions act as kettle guards. With these kettles the Salvation Army raises money and gifts to bring a feeling of Christmas to people in need. This activity also contributes to creating a genuine Christmas mood to each kettle guard. This is a very moving and rewarding experience, Lion activity at its best.

## **Our own activities**

Our own activities began with changing the board at a meeting at restaurant Huili in central Jarvenpaa, on 8/23. Past President Terhi Anttila presented me with the President's gavel and the club banner.
