Over two-thirds of the state of Queensland was declared a disaster zone. Many properties in Ipswich and Brisbane were inundated. Some areas were flooded twice within the short period of 7 to 10 days. Thousands were evacuated from homes and the death toll reached 20 and is still rising. Oprah Winfield who visited Australia before Christmas donated \$20 million to the flood relief. If you don't want to make your Queensland flood donations through Woolworths you can consider passing it through the Lions Club of Sydney Chinese Inc.

A Message from District Governor John Harrison



QUEENSLAND & NSW FLOOD APPEAL

I urge all Clubs to consider making donations and raising money to be given to assist people affected by the vast floods that have occurred in these areas.

In consultation with the District Governors and Australian Lions Foundation officers it has been recommended that all funds be sent to the District Treasurers, in our case Ken

Nimmo. The money will be held until we receive advice from Lions on the ground for the best way for it to be distributed. In the same way we will be advised as to the most appropriate and practical type of goods that may be collected and distributed.

I recommend that the Zone Chairs contact their Clubs and organise bucket type collections so that Clubs operate efficiently in their areas. Judging by the extent of the flooding we may not know the full extent of the damage for some time and we should be prepared to continue to fund raise for an extended period.

All Clubs should be prepared to issue receipts as requested but people must be told that donations made through Lions are not tax deductible but it should be stressed that **ALL** money will be distributed to flood victims.

I have been in contact with the District Governors in the affected areas and will keep everyone informed about what it is best for us to do.





Today, there are Lions Clubs in 206 countries and geographical areas all over the world. In District 201N5, which covers the Sydney area and Norfolk Island, there are some 75 Clubs with around 1,750 members. Amongst these, there are around 6 Chinese-based Clubs. Sydney Chinese Lions is the first of these Chinese-based Clubs chartered in April 1995.

Over the past fifteen years, under the leadership of President Mei Cheng, Hon. President Dr Anthony Cheung and other Past Presidents, in conjunction with the relentless effort of its members, and on top of all these, the generous donations and sponsorships received from the community, the Club has donated over \$400,000 to a number of charities including the Royal Flying Doctor Service of Australia, St John (NSW), the Australian Red Cross, the Sir David Martin Foundation, the Fred Hollows Foundation, Westmead and Concord Hospitals, the Children's Mobility (Hart Walker) Foundation and the Elderly Australian Chinese Homes.
